HCCA General Meeting

Monday, January 15, 2007

The meeting was called to order by President Chuck Vollman at 7:10 p.m. followed by the pledge of allegiance. Secretary Cynthia Greene-Eason and new Treasurer Bunny Mestel not present

The President's comments included presentation of certificates of appreciation to Pat Smith for her service as Treasurer for 2006 and Mel Pollak as vice president for 2006. A reminder that for February, Fred Lippman Center would be closed and that the meeting would again be at the Police Station. The meeting of the North Central C.A. would be at Lippman on the third Tuesday and would include a presentation from the Hollywood Memorial Hospital group.

The minutes of the November 2006 meeting was read and accepted as read.

The treasurer's report was read, account balance of \$434.26 with no transactions noted, and accepted subject to audit.

OLD BUSINESS:

Chuck reported on the outcome of the "Immediate Response" request issued in regards to the Lobbyist proposal. It was a great success as 9 of the 13 members responded in less than 24 hours. He reminded the delegates that if they did not have an IR system in place they should work on it as soon as possible to enable the council to take immediate action when needed.

NEW BUSINESS:

LESLEY BLACKNER made a presentation of “Florida Hometown Democracy” and urged all member associations to distribute the petitions and get as many signatures as possible.

VICTOR GREEN spoke about the upcoming “Relay For Life” to be held at Hollywood Beach this coming May 2007.

ECOMONIC DEVELOPMENT ROUNDTABLE discussion was lively and informative. Mel Pollak put forth a suggestion that the roundtable needs to be expanded to include such categories as bank loan officer and real estate professionals (not associated with the city) and be guided by a list of criteria that would be filled out and the information presented to the City Commission. Pete Brewer encouraged all to attend the city commission meeting on Wednesday, January 18, 2007.

MEMORIAL HOSPITAL EXPANSION was explained by Mel Pollak and asked to be invited to the other associations to speak on this subject.

Meeting was adjourned at 9:00 p.m.
