MINUTES OF APRIL 16TH, 2007

The meeting was called to order at 7:10 PM by President Chuck Vollman followed by the pledge to the flag.

County Commissioner Sue Gunzburger addressed the assembled delegates asking them to attend a meeting with her on April 25th, 2007 at 10 A.M. in her new office in the new Hollywood Library. The purpose of the meeting is to find out what the county can do for its citizens of Hollywood. She requested that if the HCCA delegate could not attend to please send an alternate representative.

This was followed by Pres. Vollman reading a letter from Park East Civic Association requesting HCCA to aid them in their opposition to the present size and scope of the proposed Sheridan Stationside Village to replace the Okomo Trailer Park and the Tri-Rail Station.

The minutes of the March 19th meeting were read by Vice Pres. Mel Pollak and accepted as read.

Bunny Mestel gave the Treasurer's report. Dues were received from the Hollywood Lakes Section Civic Association (HLSCA), a check to the amount of \$61.25 was issued to pay for the Association's registration with the State of Florida, thus bringing the account balance to \$342.41. Report was accepted subject to audit.

A request by President Chuck Vollman to handle new business before old business was passed.

NEW BUSINESS: Lisa Heller, from the Dog Park of Hollywood, presented the council with an update on their progress to establish a dog park on Hollywood Beach. It would consist of .05 mile and presently planned to be between Pershing and McClellan streets, but this is flexible. They are modeling this park after the one from Ft. Lauderdale which has been in existence for 14 years and has been very successful.

OLD BUSINESS: The letter from Park East Civic Association, regarding the Sheridan Stationside Village project was taken up. Park East's position on this project is that they are not opposed to something being constructed at that location

but that the present project is far too large and the traffic impact alone would be totally detrimental to the well being of the residents of Park East, North Central and the surrounding areas. A roundtable discussion took place with many excellent suggestions offered by the delegates from the Hollywood Beach Alliance, Driftwood, Hollywood Hills, Hollywood Lakes Section, Park East and UNOSH. All of the suggestions will be compiled and a draft of the letter to the County Planning Board will be drawn up and sent to all members via email for corrections, additions and approval. The next presentation by Sheridan Stationside will be made to the County Planning Council on Thursday, April 26th, 2007. It is requested that all those who are able to attend and support Park East in their efforts should do so.

Meeting was adjourned at 9 P.M.
