The HCCA general meeting was called to order on Monday, October 15, 2007 @ 7:15 P.M. by President, Chuck Vollman.

Minutes were read by secretary, Cynthia Greene-Eason, and accepted with one correction.

Treasurer, Bunny Mestel, reported \$338.46 in the account. Report accepted subject to audit.

Chuck introduced Broward County Commissioner, Suzanne Gunzburger, who in turn, introduced her assistant, Dee Platt. Sue spoke about homestead exemption, tree grants, and answered several questions about homestead exemption, super exemptions, etc. She suggested that we await the official ballot language. She also spoke about affordable housing, and the lack thereof, in Hollywood. It is estimated that it will take 7-10 years before condo sales improve.

Old Business

Elections were held by written ballot after each of the two candidates for HCCA president spoke briefly. 7 voting paid up delegates were eligible to vote.

New Business

Cynthia read a letter from Condos of Hollywood Beach requesting HCCA assistance on passing the Zyscovich master plan for Hollywood Beach. Several member of the CHB steering committee who were attending as guests spoke about the necessity to get the plan passed quickly, without changes. Mel suggested that there should be meetings with commissioners re: the plan. Chuck asked delegates could speak for their associations and endorse a letter urging the city to expedite passage of the plan. Motion was made by Pat Smith and seconded by Helen Chervin to endorse the plan and its speedy passage. Motion carried unanimously. Chuck suggested that the press be made aware of the fact that HCCA endorsed the plan and requested that each association talk to their commissioner.

Mel explained the sewage outflow situation and why Governor Crist is advocating deep wells. The city of Hollywood officially opposes the governor's plan because of the expense involved.

Cynthia will email Mel's letter re: deep injection wells to the membership.
